Beth fydd ar gael yn 2021?

Fydd hi ddim yn bosibl sefyll yr ystod lawn o brofion o fewn y cymhwyster hwn yn 2021, oherwydd yr argyfwng iechyd cyhoeddus. Fodd bynnag, *bydd* hi'n bosibl i ymgeiswyr sefyll y prawf Siarad **ar-lein** a derbyn Datganiad Cyrhaeddiad, gan gynnwys y marc a ddyfarnwyd.

Pryd bydd hyn yn digwydd?

Dyma ddyddiad y prawf:

Dydd Gwener 11 Mehefin 2021

Bydd eich canolfan arholi'n rhoi gwybod union amser eich prawf Siarad ymlaen llaw.

Erbyn pryd mae'n rhaid cofrestru?

Rhaid cofrestru erbyn 5 Mawrth 2021. Fydd cofrestriadau hwyr ddim yn cael eu derbyn.

Faint mae'r arholiad yn ei gostio?

Fydd dim ffi i ymgeiswyr sy wedi cofrestru ar gwrs 'Dysgu Cymraeg' yn 2021. Fodd bynnag, wrth gofrestru, dych chi'n ymrwymo i sefyll y prawf. Os dych chi'n ymgeisydd preifat, cysylltwch â'ch canolfan arholi i gael gwybodaeth am y ffi.

Sut ydw i'n cofrestru?

Rhaid i bob ymgeisydd gofrestru gyda eich darparwr Dysgu Cymraeg. Chi sy'n gyfrifol am hyn, nid eich tiwtor. Ni ellir cofrestru'n uniongyrchol gyda CBAC.

Beth sy'n digwydd yn y prawf Siarad?

Bydd pob prawf Siarad yn cael ei recordio ar lwyfan addysgu arferol eich darparwr (e.e. Zoom neu MS Teams). Bydd y recordiad yn cael ei anfon i CBAC a bydd yn cael ei asesu'n allanol. Peidiwch â chofrestru os nad ydych chi fodlon cael eich recordio yn y modd hwn.

Fel arfer, mae'r prawf yn para tua 20 munud.
Cyn dechrau'r prawf, bydd rhaid i chi ddangos ID ffotograffig i'r cyfwelydd, er mwyn cadarnhau pwy ydych chi.

Cynnwys y prawf

Mae 2 ran i'r prawf Siarad:

- i. Trafod pwnc
- ii. Sgwrs gyffredinol

i. Trafod pwnc

Bydd y trefnydd yn anfon Taflen yr Ymgeisydd atoch chi drwy ebost 30 munud cyn dechrau'r prawf er mwyn i chi baratoi'r pwnc i'w drafod. Rhaid i chi ddewis un pwnc i'w drafod gyda'r cyfwelydd llafar. Mae'r rhan hon yn para tua 5 munud.

ii. Sgwrs gyffredinol

Bydd y cyfwelydd yn gofyn cwestiynau i chi am eich cefndir chi, gwaith, teulu, diddordebau, eich profiadau'n dysgu Cymraeg, gwyliau neu unrhyw bwnc sy'n codi yn ystod y sgwrs.

Asesir eich gallu:

- i siarad yn gywir
- i amrywio amserau a geirfa
- i ryngweithio â'r cyfwelydd
- i sgwrsio'n briodol
- i ynganu Cymraeg
- i estyn ymatebion

Canlyniadau

Byddwch chi'n cael eich marc am y prawf Siarad tua wyth wythnos wedyn, ac yn derbyn Datganiad Cyrhaeddiad erbyn diwedd mis Medi. Mae'n bosib cael Rhagoriaeth neu Lwyddo (neu Fethu) yn y prawf hwn. I lwyddo, bydd rhaid i chi gael 60% o'r marciau posibl fel arfer. Mae'r union ffiniau'n cael eu penderfynu mewn cyfarfod dyfarnu.

Manyleb lawn a phapurau enghreifftiol

Braslun o'r arholiad sy yn y llyfryn hwn. Ceir y manylion llawn yn y fanyleb i diwtoriaid. Mae papurau enghreifftiol hefyd ar gael ar wefan CBAC ac enghreifftiau fideo o brofion Siarad, gw. www.cbac.co.uk dan 'Cymraeg i Oedolion Canolradd.

Gwarchod data

Os byddwch chi'n cofrestru i sefyll arholiad gyda'ch darparwr 'Dysgu Cymraeg', bydd gofyn i chi ddarparu peth data personol. Rhennir eich data cofrestru gyda'r Ganolfan Dysgu Cymraeg Genedlaethol. Anfonir peth o'r data hyn, sef enwau blaen, cyfenw, dyddiad geni a rhyw, gan y Ganolfan Dysgu Cymraeg Genedlaethol i CBAC. Mae'n angenrheidiol rhannu eich data personol yn y modd hwn er mwyn eich galluogi i sefyll yr arholiad a derbyn dyfarniad. Mae gwybodaeth am sut mae CBAC yn prosesu eich data personol ar gael yma: www.cbac.co.uk dan Amdanom ni > Polisiâu>Gwarchod Data/Polisi Preifatrwydd. Byddwch ar ddeall na fydd eich manylion cyswllt yn cael eu rhannu â CBAC a dylid cyfeirio unrhyw ymholiad sydd gennych mewn perthynas â'r arholiad i'ch canolfan arholi, h.y. eich darparwr 'Dysgu Cymraeg'.

Anghenion Arbennig

Os oes unrhyw anghenion arbennig gyda chi, a allai effeithio ar fynediad teg i'r arholiad, e.e. trafferthion clyw, golwg neu anghenion corfforol, rhaid rhoi gwybod i'r ganolfan arholi erbyn y dyddiad cau cofrestru. 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What will be available?

It will not be possible to take the full range of tests within this qualification in 2021, because of the public health crisis. However, it *will* be possible for candidates to take the Speaking test on-line and receive a Statement of Attainment, including the mark awarded.

When will this take place?

The date of the test will be:

Friday 11 June 2021

Your exam centre will let you know the exact time of your Speaking test.

By when do I need to register?

You must register by 5 March 2021. Late registrations will not be accepted.

How much does the exam cost?

There is no fee for candidates who have registered on a 'Learn Welsh' course in 2021. However, on registration, you are committed to taking the test. If you are a private candidate, contact your exam centre to get information about the fee.

How do I register?

All candidates must register with their 'Learn Welsh' provider. You are responsible for this, not your tutor. You can not register directly with WJEC.

What happens in the Speaking test?

All speaking tests will be recorded on the teaching platform used by your provider (e.g. Zoom or MS Teams). The recording will be sent to WJEC and will be assessed externally. Do not register unless you are willing to be recorded in this way.

Usually, the test lasts for approximately 20 minutes.
You will have to show the interviewer your photographic ID, to confirm your identity.

Content of the test

There are 2 parts to the Speaking test:

- i. Topic discussion
- ii. General conversation

i. Topic discussion

The organiser will send the Candidate's Sheet to you by e-mail 30 minutes before the start of the test in order for you to prepare the discussion topic. You must choose one topic to discuss with the interviewer. This part lasts around 5 minutes.

ii. General conversation

The interviewer will ask you questions about your background, work, family, interests, your experiences learning Welsh, holidays or any subject which crops up during the conversation.

You will be assessed on your ability to:

- speak accurately
- vary tenses and vocabulary
- interact with the interviewer
- to chat appropriately
- to pronounce Welsh
- to extend responses

Results

You will get your mark for the Speaking test approximately 8 weeks afterwards, and receive a Statement of Attainment by the end of September. It's possible to get Distinction or Pass (or Fail) in this test. To pass, you usually need to achieve 60% of the possible marks. The exact grade boundary is decided in an award meeting.

Data protection

If you register to take an exam with your 'Learn Welsh' provider, you will be asked to provide certain personal data. Your registration data will be shared with the National Centre for Learning Welsh. Some of these data, i.e. forenames, surname, date of birth and gender, will be sent by the National Centre for Learning Welsh to WJEC. It is necessary for your personal data to be shared in this way in order to facilitate your taking the exam and receiving an award. Please be aware that your contact details will not be shared with WJEC and any queries you have in relation to the exam should be directed to your exam centre, i.e. your 'Learn Welsh' provider.
