





Thank you for your interest in a Welsh for adults course. This booklet contains information for you about the service we offer and how you can turn to us for support in order that you get the best possible experience as a Welsh learner.

Language Learning Levels

What Level?

Welsh courses are available at five levels:

Entry: Courses for beginners, where the emphasis is on conversational Welsh. Learn how to use the present, past and future on this level.

Foundation: Students are able to expand their speaking skills. The course will cover other tenses including conditional.

Intermediate: More writing, reading and listening is introduced - but the emphasis is still on speaking the language whilst revising work covered on Entry and Foundation.

Advanced: Courses help students strengthen their written skills and more complex grammar points but mainly concentrate on enhancing speaking skills.

Proficiency: For experienced learners as well as fluent speakers who want to improve their skills.

Courses

Learn Welsh the Vale is a provider for the National Centre for Learning Welsh. We deliver the courses published by the Centre, and access to the courses and additional resources is at www.learnwelsh.cymru



All our tutors are qualified educators or attending tutor training currently. Regular training is provided to ensure that we continually develop our skills.

Each course is assigned a tutor who, barring unforeseen circumstances, will teach the class for the duration of the course.

Where are the classes this year?

Learners have the choice of how to access courses. In 2021-2022 we continue to offer many courses at a distance, using the programme Zoom to provide a digital classroom.

Some courses are taught in centres, face to face, with the tutor in the room with the learners.

In a few cases the tutor will connect to Zoom in the classroom and include distance learners and learners in class in the same lesson (this is referred to as Hybrid teaching).

Blended Learning

In addition to the option of distance learning with a tutor, there are Blended Learning courses, in which interactive learning resources are available on the Learn Welsh website for the learner to access in between lessons on-line with a tutor. Self-study before every lesson enables faster progress, and on these courses there is digital support with the tutor in addition to lessons on line with a group and the tutor. These courses are innovative and continue to be developed currently.

Blended learning is currently available at Entry and Foundation levels, with Intermediate level under development this year.

A Blended learning student who completes individual study once a week and a weekly lesson with a tutor, will complete one level in a year.



Pace of Learning

In our programme of mainstream courses there is a choice of pace for the learner.

- One lesson a week- two hours with a tutor, in a classroom or on Zoom. The learner will complete half a level in a year (30 lessons).
- Two lessons per week- four hours with a tutor, in a classroom or on Zoom. The learner will complete a whole level in a year (60 lessons).
- Blended learning - 2.5 to 3 hours in an online lesson with a tutor, and 2 hours' interactive study weekly - the learner will complete a level in a year.
- Block Course - Very Fast Track- this is the most intensive course offered by Learn Welsh the Vale. One full week of learning Monday to Friday, once a month. The learner will complete a whole level in five weeks (over five months), or two levels in one year of ten block weeks. During 2021-2022 the block courses will be on Zoom only.

Choosing more than one course

Learners are welcome to enrol in more than one course at a time. The learner will be able to have the second course at half price. We particularly encourage learners on the block course to attend a weekly course as well, in order to practise and continue to progress in between the blocks.

Exams by Welsh Joint Education Committee (WJEC)

WJEC provides Welsh for Adults examinations called "*Using Welsh*". The exams are available at Entry Level in January and in the summer term, and at Foundation, Intermediate and Higher Levels during the summer term. Learn Welsh the Vale has registered as an Examination Centre and usually run the exams at



Barry Library. During 2021 on-line Oral exams were the only exams offered. A full programme of exams is likely to be offered in 2022.

Learners can choose to sit an exam on completion of a level, or the following year. Each candidate will be offered information, advice and revision materials, and a free Revision Course to help them prepare for the exam.

Taster Courses

Taster courses offer a chance for interested adults to have an introduction to the Welsh language and the experience of learning with a tutor in a class, whether in person or on-line. Taster courses are free and last from one to three lessons.

Reading Courses

On a reading course a tutor will support a group of learners to read a book together. Reading courses are free, with the learner expected to purchase the book in advance of the first lesson. A ten-hour reading course is usually held over five or ten weeks.

Revision Courses

Revision courses are provided for learners on Learn Welsh the Vale courses who choose to sit a Using Welsh examination with WJEC. Every candidate will be offered the opportunity to enrol on a free revision course. During the course the learner will practise all elements of the exam, including a one-to-one oral interview with a tutor, followed by personal feedback.

Sadwrn Siarad (Saturday School)



Around twice a term we offer a Sadwrn Siarad, which is an opportunity for learners to practise and revise their Welsh with different learners and tutors. This year we anticipate that some Saturday schools will be on-line and others in our centres. 'Sadwrn Siarad' runs from 09.30-13.00.

Fees & Payment

Course fees: All courses of 60 hours or longer cost £90.00

Concessions: Concessions are available for those in receipt of means-tested benefits and full-time students.

Special Offers:

Pay for your first course and get a second course for half price!

Discount offers are sometimes available - if you haven't seen a discount advertised you can contact the office to ask if there is a current offer.

Vale of Glamorgan Council staff can register for a funded place on a course with Learn Welsh the Vale. Please enrol online without paying, and then contact our office to request a staff funding form.

Employees of other Organisations whose workplace agree to pay for the course can enrol online and then contact us to request that we invoice their employer for the fees.

Please pay online when you enrol. We cannot accept card payments in the office or over the phone. If you wish to pay through the office you can write a cheque made payable to: “Vale of Glamorgan Council”. If you are posting a cheque, please write the course code and name on the reverse and ensure you have enrolled online before posting.

To pay with cash please visit the office.

Withdrawing from a Course & Refunds

A learner can withdraw from a course at any time by contacting the office, or by no longer attending lessons. After four weeks of absence the learner will be automatically withdrawn from the course. No refund will be agreed unless there are exceptional circumstances. The Learning Development Officer will consider any such request and make a decision based on the information provided by the learner.

A person who has enrolled on a course and paid in full but has never attended can contact the office to request a refund within a month of the start of the course. In this case a refund may be given if requested, subject to a £10 administration fee which will be deducted from the refund.

Financial Support

The Welsh Government supports students across Wales who are in need of additional financial assistance by way of its Financial Contingency Fund. Some adult Learn Welsh students may be eligible to apply for money from this fund. Please note that the fund cannot be used to pay course fees. Other costs such as travel, books, and childcare may be reimbursed depending on your

Complaints and Compliments

Learn Welsh the Vale wishes to continually improve our service to learners. We welcome comments at any time of the year, we record and respond to them.

Feedback

Every year during the Spring term you will have the opportunity to complete a feedback survey called “Dweud eich Dweud”- “Have your Say”. The questionnaire will be sent to you by the National Centre for Learning Welsh, and you can complete it anonymously, and return it digitally and confidentially.

The National Centre will process all responses received, and analyse and report on a national basis and individually for each provider. This means that we receive the feedback for our service and can compare our performance to the national trend. Learn Welsh the Vale will publish a document “You said - We did” which will be sent to all learners by email and detail how we have acted in response to the learners’ feedback.

How to Complain

If you are unhappy about something on your course, please follow these steps:



- In the first place speak with your tutor. Sometimes an informal conversation about your feelings or complaint is enough to draw their attention and give the tutor an opportunity to respond and solve the issue.
- The next step if you can't discuss with the tutor, if the tutor's response is unsatisfactory or if discussion with the tutor would be inappropriate, is to contact the office with your comments or complaint. We will make a record of your call and respond in a timely and appropriate way. The Learning Development Officer, Mared Furnham, will consider your complaint, respond and contact you.
- If you are not satisfied with the response of the Officer, please contact the Culture and Community Learning Manager, Phil Southard.

How to Compliment

Please follow the above steps to share your praise or positive feedback. Compliments will be noted and passed on to the relevant staff to ensure that they receive all positive feedback about their work.

Lessons

Your tutor will prepare and deliver lessons according to the Course you are following. Once a week courses will cover half a unit per lesson. Twice a week courses will cover a unit every week. Blended learning classes will cover one unit per week.

Usually the learners will have a short break during the lesson. In a centre you will be able to leave the classroom and use the facilities. We recommend that you bring a drink with you.



During a lesson on Zoom it's important for the tutor and learners to have a break, to get up and move rather than stay seated in one place for the whole lesson.

Your tutor will provide contact details to the learners, for the purposes of communication about lessons, homework and attendance.

You may discuss establishing a social media group with the tutor and other learners, on a medium such as Facebook or WhatsApp. There are benefits to being in contact as a group, such as mutual support and encouragement, and sharing messages and information if a learner misses a lesson. However, there is no obligation on any learner to join such a group. If you consent to join, giving your contact information to the other learners is seen as your agreement.

Course Books

On most levels the learner will need to purchase or access the course book. An email with purchase information will be sent to you after you have enrolled online.

Your course book has a soft spine and punch holes ready for you to place it in a ring binder file. If you would like a file there are many available to re-use in the office, please ask for one.

The courses are also available digitally on the website.

The coursebooks include oral, written, listening, watching and reading tasks, as well as vocabulary lists and homework sections.

Please bring a pen or pencil and notebook to every lesson.

Homework

Each unit in the course book is accompanied by homework for the learner to study and complete outside class time. Your tutor will mark your homework and return it to you within a reasonable time frame. The homework page is detachable from the course book and



can then be returned to your file after marking. Homework is also available as different digital formats on request from your tutor, for those who wish to complete it on their computer and present it to the tutor by email.

Additional Resources

There are many additional resources to support your progress on the national website at www.learnwelsh.cymru. You will find interactive tasks, revision materials, access to the listening and viewing tracks and much more! Please spend some time exploring the website to see what interests you, or ask your tutor to help you if you are unsure how to navigate the site.

Lessons in a classroom- Face to Face learning

Each centre or location will have been considered carefully and assessed in terms of risk and Covid safety, as well as our Standard Health and Safety Policy. Before the beginning of your course you will receive a copy of the guidance for your location/classroom by email. We will ask you to comply with the guidance outlined, and to be aware that these may change in response to the public health situation. Learn Welsh the Vale operates within the Vale of Glamorgan Council's remit and policies, and delivers courses according to the latest Welsh Government advice to providers of Post-16 education (<https://gov.wales/guidance-safe-operation-post-16-learning>).

Do not attend class or visit the centre if you have any sign or symptom of Covid-19.

Classroom activities

Your tutor will plan the lesson according to the Course. Some tasks in the unit may be allocated as homework. The tutor will ensure



that the activities are varied within the lesson, and may ask you to do activities in pairs or in groups if this can be done safely within Covid guidelines.

Lessons on Zoom

Although you are not able to interact in person, your tutor will organise the lesson to ensure that there is a variety of activities, and opportunities for the learners to practice all the language skills, with particular emphasis on speaking. Your tutor will be able to guide you in the use of the basic tools on Zoom, such as using Mute and turning your camera off and on. He or she will use the Breakout Rooms feature to organise you in pairs or groups to do tasks together. When this happens, you will need to click to accept the invitation to the room. The tutor will visit the breakout rooms to support the learning. At the end of the task the tutor will recall you back into the main classroom, this will happen automatically, although you can react to a prompt to agree to leave the group and rejoin sooner. While you're in your lesson and in a breakout room, you can use "Raise hand" feature to indicate that you would like the tutor's attention.

Online Safety

You can join your class from any location which has reliable Internet, with your own digital equipment. Whilst this has many advantages for the learner, please take some time to consider how you can take care to protect your own privacy and that of any people in the vicinity, including potentially your family members or children. Think about where to sit and what is visible when the camera is on. Your tutor will ask you to keep the camera on as much as possible, so try and establish a comfortable place to sit with a neutral background. If there are other people around when you are in your lesson, use the Mute button to ensure that background noise in your location doesn't interfere with the lesson. You can Unmute to speak and Mute again afterwards. Use your camera on



& off button with discretion- for example, if you are at home and your children come in in their pyjamas to say goodnight, turn off the camera for a few minutes to protect their privacy.

Tutor Absence, Adverse Weather and Covid Closures

If your tutor is unable to teach for any reason, we will do our best to provide cover by sending another tutor from our team. In the unfortunate event that we cannot arrange cover, the lesson will be postponed, and an additional date will be arranged for a catch-up lesson. The tutor or office staff will contact all learners to inform them if the lesson is being postponed.

In the event of adverse weather, local emergencies and directed closures due to Covid, the tutor will offer lessons on Zoom.

Please ensure you update your online enrolment or inform the office if you change your contact details during the year.

Support with Digital Skills

Your tutor will help you to navigate in Zoom. However, if you would like to develop your skills and/or your confidence in using your computer or laptop/tablet, training and courses are available with the Get Back on Track programme which is also run from Palmerston Centre. Many of these courses are free to attend. Please contact the office at Learn Welsh the Vale or the main office at Palmerston Centre to enrol or enquire.

Computers & Digital Devices

To get the best experience of your online lessons you will need to use a computer, laptop or tablet with the Zoom app downloaded on it already. Although it's possible to join a Zoom meeting on a



Smartphone, all the features are not available so you may be unable to take a full part in the lesson.

Learn Welsh the Vale has a number of Samsung tablets available to loan to current students. If you would like to borrow one, please contact our office.

Attendance and Absence

Tutors register learners' attendance on digital registers which are safely stored on the Dysgu Cymraeg national website. If you are unable to come to your lesson please let your tutor know before the lesson if possible.

After two consecutive absences your tutor will contact you unless they have heard from you in the meantime.

After four consecutive absences you will be withdrawn from the course. Should you wish to re-join the course you will need to contact the office and re-enrol.

Catching up

All sorts of things can happen in daily life that could affect your ability to come to your Welsh class. Your tutor will make every effort to support you, and to help you to catch up if you have missed a lesson or two. If you have missed three or more lessons it may be more difficult to catch up by just returning to class, but don't worry - we can help! Have a word with your tutor, or contact the office directly and we will organise support for you. It may be suitable to direct you to revision materials on-line, or we can arrange a catch-up lesson with one of the team, at a time convenient to you.

Additional Learning Needs



Learners have the opportunity to record any additional need or condition of which they wish the Service to be aware during the enrolment process on-line. Following the receipt of this information, the office will contact the learner to ask their consent to pass on this information to their tutor. When the tutor has been made aware of the needs of a learner in this way, reasonable adjustments will be made in order to ensure that the learner is included in all aspects of the course. We encourage learners to discuss their needs with the tutor, especially if there are adaptations that can be made once the tutor understands the needs of the learner. Any learner who chooses not to declare any additional needs on the enrolment form can approach the tutor to discuss their needs in confidence.

All Learn Welsh the Vale tutors attend training in which we learn about Specific Learning Difficulties and other learning needs. Your tutor will respond sensitively to your needs and may request support, advice or further training from the Lead Tutor in order to learn how to help you in the most appropriate ways. You are welcome to contact us in the office if you would like to discuss ways in which we can improve your learning experience.

Protection of Vulnerable Adults and Child Protection

Learn Welsh the Vale operates within the Vale of Glamorgan Council policy on Safeguarding Vulnerable Adults and Child Protection. Who are our learners?

Whilst the majority of our learners live in the Vale of Glamorgan, some travel in from nearby areas to lessons, and since the advent of on-line distance learning, some attend class from countries across the world! Our lessons are conducted through the medium of English, and as the learners progress, the balance of English and Welsh spoken in the lessons changes. You can expect to receive directions and explanations in English when you attend an Entry level class, and as you understand more Welsh, the tutor will gradually reduce the amount of English used in lessons. During Foundation and Intermediate levels the tutor will increase the use of the target language - Welsh. In a Higher level class you can expect the lesson to be held in Welsh. Our Fluency level classes offer the opportunity for advanced learners- sometimes known as New Speakers -“Siaradwyr Newydd” to use their Welsh and continue to polish their skills whilst learning about a wider range of subjects.

Educational background

Whilst some adult learners have had positive experiences in school, college and university, we welcome people to our classes whose experience of education was less positive, or even simply a long time ago. Your tutor will do their best to be encouraging and help you to build confidence and learning skills.

Welsh language background and true beginners



All the Entry level 1 courses will begin at the beginning, with an introduction to the pronunciation and letter sounds, greetings etc. If you know a little bit of Welsh already, please be patient while the class focuses on the very basics. Learners who have never heard the language previously may benefit from joining a Taster course before Entry One, to give you more time to explore the new sounds and structures, although this is not a requirement.

It's all coming back to me now!

Have you joined a course and found you remember more than you thought you would? If you think you would benefit from moving up a level or two, have a chat with your tutor in the first instance. The staff in the office can help you to find a suitable alternative, and transfer your enrolment once you are happy with the new class.

It's so challenging!

Are you finding the learning hard going? Talk to your tutor! There are some things you can do to help your progress and confidence.

- Make time between lessons to go over what you learned
- Always do your homework- this helps you and your tutor to see how you are getting on
- Attend a Saturday school- "Sadwrn Siarad"
- Explore language Apps which have Welsh resources e.g. Duolingo
- Come to our events and meet other learners
- Use your class Whatsapp or Facebook group to share ideas and encouragement
- Join a second course at the same level, and go over everything twice
- Listen and watch- other people speaking Welsh, or Welsh programmes on Radio Cymru and S4C.



- If you have children learning Welsh in school, read with them and try out your Welsh phrases at home
- At work, ask any Welsh-speaking colleagues to encourage you to try out your Welsh with them
- At Intermediate and Higher level, join the Siarad Scheme to get a Welsh-speaking buddy who will chat with you regularly
- Look out for our Caffi Cymraeg/Welsh Cafe on a Saturday morning 10-12. This is currently held on Zoom but may return to Barry Library as circumstances allow.
- Look out for people wearing an orange speech bubble badge/lanyard – try your Welsh in the community.

Celebrating and Speaking Welsh Together

Learn Welsh the Vale staff organise several events every year to which learners and their families and friends are invited. We celebrate traditional events including Christmas and the Celtic New Year, as well as St David's Day.

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How Learn Welsh is Funded

Learn Welsh the Vale is funded through a grant which is paid by the National Centre for Learning Welsh on behalf of Welsh Government. The Vale of Glamorgan Council is contracted to deliver a full programme of Learn Welsh courses on the terms of the National Centre, and Learn Welsh the Vale is accountable to the Centre for the quality of the provision. The National Centre for Learning Welsh and all its providers are inspected by Estyn.

The Vale of Glamorgan's contract with the National Centre for Learning Welsh is on a three-year cycle, with the grant awarded annually. The sum of the grant depends on the performance of the provider against the targets set by the Centre. Academic Year 2021-2022 is the last year in the current three-year cycle. The process of applying for a new contract will take place during the Autumn of 2021, in order to ensure the continuation of provision for August 2022 onwards.
